Paid Family and Medical Leave (PFML) could provide valuable support, allowing family members to care for their loved ones without losing their jobs or income. Families could keep aging parents at home and potentially avoid costly institutional care facilities.

Community and Home-Based Care is Better

Without PFML, seniors often enter costly institutional care because family members cannot balance work and caregiving. Paid leave helps families provide care at home, preserving seniors' savings and avoiding unnecessary reliance on Medicaid.

Meeting the needs of an aging population


